


Do you ever wish you could do more for the youth in your home or church?

We're here to help.





Street Invaders is a summer youth missions program for students ages 13-18 that is designed to help them put their faith into action.

Students will learn how to walk in relationship with Jesus while being empowered to make a difference wherever they go.

Our philosophy is simple: "Discipleship through evangelism." We accomplish this by giving youth the opportunity to meet with God, to see Holy Spirit move, and be transformed as they share the Gospel. We have seen thousands of young people all over the world become passionate disciples of Jesus.

Our program consists of two parts: Training and Mission.

We begin our programs with 3-5 days of training at Churches and Bible Colleges around Canada. When students come to training they are empowered with practical skills through taking classes, practicing outreach, and participating in vibrant worship. Students also have time during training to bond with their mission team, prepare for their mission, and participate in fun activities.

After their training period, we send students out on a mission. We give them the chance to apply what they learned during training in many diverse mission locations across Canada and even globally.

There are three types of missions that students can participate in:

Regional

Regional teams do their mission at a church, mission, etc. that is within driving distance of the training location. Students on regional teams are equipped to grow in their walk with Jesus, personally share the gospel, and step out in faith within communities that are similar to one that they have come from. This could be a city or a town.

National

National teams are usually considered as a specialized mission within Canada and they will require a long drive (1 day +) or a flight. Students must sign up in advance and they are more expensive due to the transportation and mission costs. Some examples of a national mission option could be church planting, working with a particular people group, the National House of Prayer in Ottawa, or a mission sponsored through a city mission such as working on Hastings Street in Vancouver.

International

International teams are any team that must travel outside of Canada. The teams have the opportunity to not only share their faith but to do so in a new culture which they may be experiencing for the very first time. Street Invaders has sent international teams all over the world to participate in ministry in schools, institutions, mission bases, church planting, children's work, sports events, and so much more.

Wrap Up

At the conclusion of their missions, students return to their launching province for a worship service. They share testimonies, celebrate, pray, and worship the Lord. Students then return home to make a difference in their own communities. Parents and Pastors are welcome to come hear stories and celebrate with the students and leaders.

If there's anything true about students today, it's this: they want to know the truth, and they want to make a difference. That's what Street Invaders is all about. **We believe that Jesus created students to bring change to the world.**



Street Invaders was originally started by British Youth For Christ in England and has been in existence in Canada since 1989.



Street Invaders was pioneered by and continues to be directed through United Youth Outreach (formerly Apostolic Youth Ministries International). Street Invaders is an interdenominational program which works with Christian churches across Canada, the United States and in different parts of the world.

Our goal with the program is to see young people come to a greater commitment as disciples of Christ, where they are willing to give their entire lives to Him. Street Invaders uses evangelism and outreach as a means of developing these students into disciples and as a result, we have seen hundreds of other people won to Christ, discipled and sent out to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ.

The first Street Invaders program was launched in July 1989 with a group of students from Kedleston camp in Saskatchewan. The program began with 21 students—enough for 3 mission teams.

The program eventually grew to 2 locations in SK and BC, with various outreach locations in each province. Since that time, programs have been held in Kamloops, Kelowna, Prince George, and Surrey, BC, as well as Calgary, Winnipeg, and various locations in Ontario, New Brunswick, and Quebec.

International teams have travelled to a variety of locations including Scotland, England, Northern Ireland, various areas of Africa including South Africa, Japan, China, Philippines, Malaysia, Turkey, El Salvador, Mexico, Guatemala, Australia, Estonia, Ecuador, United States, Malta, Thailand, etc.

For over 30 years, Street Invaders has gathered, trained and released students to share the love of Jesus Christ around the world. The summer youth missions program has a rich history of seeing lives changed forever through sharing the Gospel. Our DNA includes powerful worship, waiting on God, empowering students, discipleship through evangelism, and releasing teens into opportunities to see the Holy Spirit at work.





The philosophy of Street Invaders is 'discipleship through evangelism'. We have seen thousands of students make their faith real as they care for those both on their team and on their mission. Whether a student comes alone or with their youth group, attending Street Invaders is one of the best decisions they will make for developing their character and walk in relationship with Jesus.

With a rich history behind us, our goal reaching into the future is to establish a program in each province and territory, as well as various locations around the world. We encourage everyone to consider partnering with Street Invaders to see this worthy goal accomplished.

Leaders

The longevity of Street Invaders is sourced in the leaders who serve in the program. The senior leaders are people of integrity, honesty, and humility. This is something I look for if I'm investing my time, my children and my students in any organization.

There is no better summer program to reach the needs of the community around you, locally and globally, and bring transformation in the lives of the students involved.

The DNA of Street Invaders

Street Invaders is about young people being discipled through an original form evangelism. It's about being pressed and pushed. It's about being taught and equipped, and about sharing the faith they've known through their parents and their church. But ultimately, it's all about the Gospel and changing the hearts of the students themselves and those they impact through the program.

Theology

We believe in the gifts of the Spirit - a key takeaway for students. They see the Holy Spirit moving actively, producing fruit in their lives and helping them move the mission forward. By seeing God work in practical ways, students are encouraged, inspired, and challenged to follow their individual callings. It catapults students into thinking evangelistically, when sometimes it can be hard to think that way in their current context.

to pour into our leaders, pray together and equip them with all they need to succeed. We have support staff who will encourage them, check in with them on their missions and give them what they need.

Street Invaders has lasted 30 years, and it will continue to last because it makes a huge impact in kids' lives. It's a program unlike any other.


